
Teacher contracts have been mailed to site administrators. Thank you for choosing to work for YKSD. We know that you have choices.

# **AIMSweb Progress Monitoring**

You can use progress monitoring to see how your students are doing as well as giving them practice on testing. You may give them the sample tests whenever you choose...ie...once a week, everyday, or once a month. When you do give them the test, keep track of their grades. If you could email me your class roster then I can set up your "Progress Monitoring Caseload" in AIMS Web online to save you time. Then all you have to do is input grades. This is a great way to get the kids practicing for the benchmarks. Hope this helps:



# Directions for AIMS Web Progress Monitoring:

- Log into AIMS Web at: <a href="https://aimsweb.pearson.com/">https://aimsweb.pearson.com/</a>
   Login.cfm
- 2. Click on the top yellow "Downloads" tab.
- 3. Click on the "Prog. Monitor" tab to the far left.
- 4. Click on the select measure type and scroll down to "Reading" or "Mathematics" and click go.
- For reading there are several passages to choose from...I suggest doing them in order from top to bottom.
- 6. For math, click on the top "M-COMP" tab. There are several probes available for grades 1-8.
- 7. The test administration directions are the same as the Fall and Winter exams. 8 minutes for math tests and 1 min. for each of the three passages for reading...and take the middle score.

#### **Directions for Entering Grades**

- 1. Login to AIMS Web
- 2. Click on the blue Progress Monitoring Tab on the top.
- 3. Click on the Schedules tab on the left side of the screen.
- 4. Find your Progress Monitoring Caseload.
- 5. Click on the Next Score columns in blue for entering grades.
- You can also change goals for each student in the Goal Columns in blue. This is also where you will find the Target Benchmark for each student.

## Counselor's Corner

During the month of January and February, the guidance office at Jimmy Huntington School focused on two developmental guidance topics: filling the bucket & human growth & development. For "filling the bucket," elementary students learned that we all carry an imaginary bucket around that we, and others either add to, or take from. Our manners and the way we treat



others causes the bucket to be filled up, or dipped into. The surprise twist is that students can fill their own buckets by treating others with kindness because we often feel good inside, when we truly are good!

Our human growth and development lesson focused on two areas: how all of our bodies change as we approach puberty, and the importance of keeping our bodies safe (appropriate/inappropriate touching). Students learned the differences among puberty for boys and girls along with specific physical changes that occur. Further, we also had "circle-talk" where students learned what's considered good and bad touching, and what to do in the event it happens to oneself or others.




